Missouri governor's amid scandal

Eric Greitens

ERSON CITY, Missouri Gov. Eric Greitens, a sometimes political outsider and unconventional as a Rhodes scholar and Navy SEAL, made him a rising star in the Republican Party. He resigned Tuesday after a widening investigation that arose from an affair with his former press secretary.

The 44-year-old governor spent nearly six months fighting to stay in office after the affair was made public in January. Television news reports aired immediately after his resignation, showing his State of the State address. The probes into his conduct by prosecutors and lawmakers were expanded to include allegations about whether he violated campaign finance laws.

Greitens said his resignation would take effect immediately. His ordeal has been described as a political scandal designed to cause an irreparable amount of strain on his family — millions of dollars of mounting bills, endless press attacks designed to cause the maximum damage to his family and friends," he said in a brief statement from his Jefferson City residence, his voice breaking.

Greitens said he could not control those forces to cause pain and guilt to the people of Missouri. "I love Missouri," he said. "I will let the fairness of this process be judged by history."

His departure will elevate fellow Republican Lt. Gov. Mike Parson — a former state lawmaker and sheriff — to the governor's office.

Parson, who will serve the remainder of Greitens' term through January 2020, pledged to carry out his new duties "with honor and integrity." He said Greitens' resignation "will allow our state to heal and move forward from what has been a difficult time."

The Greitens administration was thrown into chaos the night of Jan. 10, when a St. Louis TV station aired a report about Greitens allegedly taking a compromising photo and threatening to blackmail the woman if she ever spoke of their encounter.

Then less than two weeks ago, the Missouri Legislature began meeting in special session to consider whether to pursue impeachment proceedings to try to oust Greitens from office. A special House investigative committee had subpoenaed Greitens to testify next Monday.

Two people with close ties to Republican officials in Washington and Missouri told The Associated Press there was no coordinated effort to push Greitens out.

The governor's brashness had alienated some GOP legislators even before his affair became public. Senate Leadership Fund President Steven Law said the resignation could help unify Missouri Republicans and free up money.

In January, the woman's ex-husband released a secretly recorded conversation from 2015 in which she described the affair, which happened shortly after Greitens created an exploratory committee to run for office. The woman later told the House committee that Greitens restrained, slapped, shoved and threatened her during a series of sexual encounters that at times left her crying and afraid.

Greitens said the allegations amounted to a "political witch hunt" and vowed to stay in office. But a report from the House committee created a firestorm, with both Republicans and Democrats calling for his resignation.

Even while resigning, Greitens remained defiant. "I am not perfect. But I have not broken any laws or committed any offense worthy of this treatment," he said. "I will let the fairness of this process be judged by history."

Public Notice: Action Memorandum and Responsiveness Summary issued for the Non-Time Critical Removal Action for the C-Area Groundwater Operable Unit

The U. S. Department of Energy (DOE) has selected the preferred alternative for the non-time critical removal action for the C-Area Groundwater Operable Unit (CAGW). A thirty (30)-day public comment period for the CAGW Removal Site Evaluation Report/Engineering Evaluation/Cost Analysis was held from March 13, 2018 to April 11, 2018. The CAGW is one of the several groundwater operable units identified at the Savannah River Site (SRS). The CAGW is located within the Fourmile Branch watershed and encompasses groundwater beneath the C-Area. The C-Area is situated near the center of SRS. The CAGW includes a volatile organic compound groundwater plume containing primarily trichloroethylene (TCE), with minor quantities of tetrachloroethylene, and a tritium groundwater plume. The tritiated groundwater will be addressed in a separate, future decision and is not part of this removal action. DOE has selected Alternative 2, Treatment Barrier Using Emulsified Edible Oil for the distal portion of the CAGW TCE groundwater plume. A mixture of emulsified edible oil, water and buffer solution will be injected into the groundwater at the areas of highest TCE concentrations in the distal portion of the CAGW TCE groundwater plume. The emulsified edible oil will provide a carbon source for the microbes already present within the area that will aid in the destruction of the TCE. The emulsified oil also acts to adsorb the TCE as the water flows through the injection zone, thus reducing the mobility of the TCE. This alternative will not preclude any additional remediation of the CAGW and is expected to be consistent with the expected final remedial action.

The selection of the preferred alternative is documented in the Action Memorandum. DOE has worked with the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control and the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency to ensure that the removal action is consistent with all applicable human health and environmental requirements. Public Notice: Solvent Storage Tanks (SSTs) 333-336 Resource Conservation and Recovery Act Permit Volume XXV Revision Request

(Current permit expires 5/22/2026) The Department of Energy (DOE)-Savannah River Operations Office has requested from the Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) a revision to the Savannah River Site's (SRS) 2013 Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) Permit Renewal Application for Volume XXV. This volume of the application contains information about the Solvent Storage Tanks (SSTs) 333-336. The SSTs stored mixed waste and nonhazardous radioactive solvent in four underground double walled carbon steel tanks, each with a capacity of 30,000 gallons. The tanks were equipped with cathodic protection and leak detection in the annulus space.

The SRS is requesting a revision to its SSTs RCRA Permit to effect the following changes:

- General updates to information, including contact information, in the Contingency Plan section;
- Extensive revision to the Closure Plan section, incorporating the information submitted to DHEC in May 2017.

This notice begins a 60-day comment period. More information, including the actual permit application, is available for review and copying at the DOE Public Reading Room located in the University of South Carolina-Aiken Library, or by contacting personnel identified in this notice. The Permittee's compliance history during the life of the permit being modified is available from DHEC.
